GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Exhibitors please take notice and observe carefully.

- 1. Exhibitor's Permit - \$6.00. No entry fee required.**
2. Exhibitors may make unlimited entries in every class number, but may win only two premiums per class number.
- 3. ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED UNLESS ACCOMPANIED BY SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER, RELEASE FORM SIGNATURES, AND PAYMENT OF EXHIBITOR'S PERMIT.**
- 4. **Please Note** ENTRY FORMS MUST BE IN THE FAIR OFFICE BY 6:00 PM WEDNESDAY, JUNE 22, 2011 or POSTMARKED BY JUNE 22.** Article identification tags will be printed on the computer. The fair office is open for "walk-in" entries beginning June 13. Bring or mail your entry forms in early to avoid waiting in line.
- 5. No exhibitor will be paid a premium until a completed W-9 form is on file in our fair office. W-9 form is located on the entry form.**
- 6. ENTRY FORMS** - Exhibitor's name must match social security number given. **Entry will be determined by class number given on entry form.** Entry forms may be photocopied, if needed.
7. Article identification tags must be filled in with COMPLETE information and attached to entry in an inconspicuous place. Name to be taped to bottom of containers. Containers must be clean and plants well groomed. Please identify plants.
8. All entries in plant division must have been grown and owned by exhibitor at least sixty days.
- 9. Flowers or greenery from a florist are not allowed.**
- 10. No artificial flowers or foliage may be used.**
- 11. No entry can be exhibited more than once, if it has been exhibited in previous years and won.**
12. All entries must be in place (**in the Annex**) by 11:00 a.m. Wednesday, July 6, 2011. We encourage exhibitors not to bring flower entries before Wednesday morning, so flowers and plants are fresh for judging.
13. Every exhibit entered for competition shall be under the control of the Superintendents and staged at their and the committee's direction. The committee reserves the right to stage all categories and place all entries in correct class number.
14. Exhibitors may be present during judging. Critique and comments will be given after judging is completed if judge(s) wish to comment. Judge(s) may desire to give written comments.
15. Exhibits will be maintained during the fair, but the Fair Association and committee in no way assume responsibility for them.
16. There will be no storage space available for boxes, etc.
17. No refunds to non-winners.
- 18. Exhibits must be removed on Sunday evening, July 10, at 5 p.m.** Leaving before release time will mean forfeiture of premium checks.

There will be no Gladiolus Show in 2011. Check back in 2012.

Potted plants will be judged in accordance with shape, health, vigor, quantity and quality of flowers (if any). Pot size NOT TO EXCEED 15 INCHES IN DIAMETER.

2105. Tuberous Begonia, in bloom
2106. Dish Garden (arrangement of living plants with similar culture in a terrarium or dish garden. Must be the work of the exhibitor)

2108. Any other Named Non-Flowering Potted Plant (identify plant)
2109. Geranium/blooming (1 or more of same variety in container)
2110. Hanging Basket - flowering (identify plant)

Please use a clear glass bottle for your entry. Stem in good proportion to foliage head. Specimens are judged for quality only.

- 2113. Single specimen Hemerocallis (Daylily) (one stem)
- 2114. Hosta - single specimen - 1 LEAF-Dwarf and Miniature (less than 1" across) IDENTIFY VARIETY
- 2115. Hosta - single specimen - 1 LEAF-Small (1" - 3" across) IDENTIFY VARIETY
- 2116. Hosta - single specimen - 1 LEAF-Medium (3" - 6" across) IDENTIFY VARIETY
- 2117. Hosta - single specimen - 1 LEAF-Large (6" - 8" across) IDENTIFY VARIETY
- 2118. Hosta - single specimen - 1 LEAF-Giant (greater than 8" across) IDENTIFY VARIETY
